## हिन्दी: परंपरा, प्रगति और पहचान का सेतु

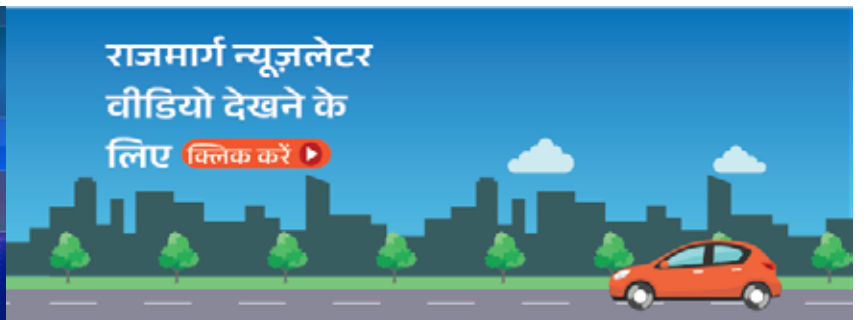
भाषा केवल संचार का एक माध्यम नहीं है; यह एक समाज की पहचान, संस्कृति और आकांक्षाओं का सार है। भारत जैसे भाषाई दृष्टि से विविध देश में, हिंदी एक विशेष स्थान रखती है, जो न केवल एक भाषाई पुल के रूप में, बल्कि एक सांस्कृतिक धरोहर के रूप में भी महत्वपूर्ण है। एक रोचक तथ्य यह है कि आजकल कई प्रचलित अंग्रेज़ी शब्द वास्तव में हिंदी से लिए गए हैं — जैसे yoga, karma, guru, shampoo आदि। ये शब्द न केवल पश्चिमी देशों में प्रसिद्ध हैं, बल्कि हमारी रोज़मर्रा की भाषा का हिस्सा बन चुके हैं। 2011 की जनगणना के अनुसार, लगभग 44%

जनसंख्या भारत में हिंदी बोलती है, भारतीय संविधान अपनी आठवीं अनुसूची में 22 भाषाओं को मान्यता देता है, जो देश की बहुभाषी पहचान को दर्शाता है।

हिंदी केवल भारत तक सीमित नहीं है; यह त्रिनिदाद और टोबैगो, मॉरीशस, नेपाल, फ़िजी, सूरीनाम और गुयाना जैसे देशों में भी बोली जाती है। विश्वभर में 43 करोड़ से अधिक लोग हिंदी को अपनी मातृभाषा के रूप में बोलते हैं, जिससे यह चीनी, स्पेनिश और अंग्रेज़ी के बाद दुनिया की चौथी सबसे अधिक बोली जाने वाली भाषा बन जाती है। हिंदी का उद्भव मुख्यतः संस्कृत से हुआ है,

जो लगभग 5000 ईसा पूर्व की प्राचीन भाषा मानी जाती है। हर वर्ष 14 सितम्बर को पूरे देश में हिन्दी दिवस बड़े उत्साह और गर्व के साथ मनाया जाता है। इस दिन का उद्देश्य केवल भाषा का उत्सव मनाना नहीं, बल्कि उसे राष्ट्र की एकता, संस्कृति और पहचान से जोड़ना भी है।

1949 में संविधान सभाने हिन्दी को भारत की राजभाषा के रूप में स्वीकार किया था, और उसी ऐतिहासिक निर्णय की याद में हिन्दी दिवस मनाने की परंपरा शुरू हुई। इसी भावना को आगे बढ़ाते हुए भारतीय राष्ट्रीय राजमार्ग प्राधिकरण में हिन्दी पखवाड़े का आयोजन किया गया।



हिन्दी को सम्पूर्ण देश में संवाद, समझ और एकता का सशक्त माध्यम मानते हुए, प्राधिकरण में प्रत्येक वर्ष हिन्दी दिवस उत्साहपूर्वक मनाया जाता है। इसी क्रम में, इस वर्ष भी भारतीय राष्ट्रीय राजमार्ग प्राधिकरण में दिनांक 14 से 28 सितम्बर 2025 तक हिन्दी पखवाड़े के अंतर्गत विविध कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया गया, जिनके माध्यम से हिन्दी भाषा के प्रति सम्मान और प्रेम का वातावरण प्राधिकरण के कार्यालय में

सृजित हुआ। हिन्दी दिवस हमें स्मरण कराता है कि हिन्दी केवल एक भाषा नहीं, बल्कि भारतीय संस्कृति, परंपरा और विविधता को जोड़ने वाली कड़ी है। पखवाड़े के दौरान प्राधिकरण में विविध प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन किया गया, जिनमें अधिकारियों एवं कर्मचारियों ने उत्साहपूर्वक भाग लिया। इसके पश्चात् 7 अक्टूबर 2025 को NHAI मुख्यालय, नई दिल्ली में हिन्दी पखवाड़ा 2025 का समापन समारोह

आयोजित हुआ। इस अवसर पर प्राधिकरण अध्यक्ष श्री संतोष कुमार यादव और प्रो. अरुण दिवाकर नाथ वाजपेयी ने प्रतियोगिताओं के विजेताओं को पुरस्कृत किया और हिन्दी के प्रचार-प्रसार में योगदान देने वाले कर्मचारियों की सराहना की। यह पूरा आयोजन हिन्दी भाषा के प्रति समर्पण, गर्व और एकता की भावना को सशक्त रूप में अभिव्यक्त करता है।

हिंदी में 11 स्वर और  
33 व्यंजन हैं।

दुनिया भर में 43 करोड़ से ज्यादा लोग हिंदी बोलते हैं, जिससे यह चीनी, स्पेनिश और अंग्रेज़ी के बाद दुनिया की चौथी सबसे ज्यादा बोली जाने वाली भाषा बन जाती है।

12 करोड़ से ज्यादा लोग हिंदी को अपनी दूसरी भाषा के रूप में बोलते हैं।

हिंदी के लगभग 400 विभिन्न संस्करण/बोलियाँ हैं, साथ ही इसकी कई क्षेत्रीय बोलियाँ भी हैं। साहित्यिक रूप से, इसकी चार मुख्य किस्में हैं: उच्च हिंदी, साहित्यिक हिंदी, नागरी हिंदी और मानक हिंदी।

भारत में हिंदी दिवस है। इस दिन, देश हिंदी को अपनी आधिकारिक भाषा के रूप में मनाता है।

हिंदी उन 7 भाषाओं में से एक है जिनका उपयोग वेबसाइट यूआरएल के लिए किया जा सकता है।

हिंदी मुख्यतः संस्कृत से उत्पन्न हुई है, जो लगभग 5,000 ईसा पूर्व की भाषा है।



# Hon'ble Prime Minister Laid Foundation Stone for National Highway Projects in Guwahati, Assam

Marking a significant boost to infrastructure development in the North-Eastern region of the country, Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for the 118.5 km long Guwahati Ring Road project on 14th September 2025. The project aims to decongest Guwahati city by providing an alternative route between Baihata Chariali and Sonapur, thereby bypassing the existing corridor that passes through the city. Designed to enhance regional mobility, the project will reduce travel time, improve logistics efficiency, and strengthen

connectivity across Assam and adjoining states. The Ring Road will play a vital role in positioning Assam as a leading economic and commercial hub of the North-Eastern region. Also on 14th September 2025, Hon'ble Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for 2.9 km long bridge over the Brahmaputra River, connecting Kuruwa in Darrang with Narengi in Guwahati. This landmark project will significantly improve connectivity between North and South Guwahati, providing a vital link to support the city's rapid

expansion. The bridge will reduce travel time and ease congestion, ensuring smoother movement of commuters and goods across the region. By enhancing inter-state connectivity for vehicles travelling from Bihar and West Bengal to the North-Eastern states, it will also bolster trade and logistics efficiency. Additionally, the bridge will facilitate movement of defence vehicles towards international borders and open new avenues for tourism, pilgrimage, agriculture, and commerce.



# Hon'ble Prime Minister Laid Foundation Stone for Two Key Sections of NH-56 in Gujarat

On 20th September 2025, Hon'ble Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for the four-laning of two key sections of NH-56 in Bhavnagar, Gujarat. The projects included 38.3 km long Jabugam–Dhamasiya section in Chhotaudepur and 29 km long Bitada/Movi–Nasarpore section in Bharuch.

Widening of these sections will significantly enhance connectivity across Chhotaudepur, Narmada, Bharuch, Surat, and Tapi districts, including the Aspirational District of Narmada. The improved National Highway network will provide seamless access to major attractions such as the Statue of Unity,

Sardar Sarovar Dam, and eco-tourism destinations like Jambughoda, Ratanmahal, Shoolpaneshwar, and Purna Wildlife Sanctuaries. It will also facilitate smoother travel to spiritual and heritage sites including Unai Mata Temple and nearby pilgrimage destinations in the state of Gujarat.



## Hon'ble Prime Minister Laid Foundation Stone and Inaugurated Various NH Projects in Andhra Pradesh

In a major step towards decongesting Visakhapatnam and boosting trade and employment opportunities in the region, Hon'ble Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for the six-lane Sabbavaram - Sheelanagar Greenfield corridor on 16th October 2025. Hon'ble Prime Minister also inaugurated

important National Highway projects including the four-laning of the Pileru-Kalur section, widening from Kadapa/Nellore border to CS Puram, and the construction of a four-lane Rail Over Bridge (ROB) between Gudivada and Nujella Railway Stations on NH-165. Other

key projects included a major bridge across the Papagni River on NH-716, Kanigiri Bypass, these initiatives will enhance travel efficiency and strengthen regional connectivity, furthering economic development across Andhra Pradesh.



## Hon'ble Prime Minister Laid Foundation Stone in Chhattisgarh

On 1st November 2025, the Hon'ble Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for the construction of the 4-lane Greenfield Pathalgaon-Kunkuri to Chhattisgarh/Jharkhand border section of NH-43 in

Chhattisgarh. This project forms a key part of the 627 km Raipur-Dhanbad Economic Corridor. It will enhance inter-state connectivity for coal and steel industries, improve logistics efficiency, and support regional

trade. The project will reduce travel time and vehicular pollution, generate employment opportunities and drive socio-economic development across the region.



## Shri Nitin Gadkari Laid Foundation Stone and Dedicated to the Nation Various NH Projects in Puducherry

On 13th October 2025, Hon'ble Minister for Road Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari, laid the foundation stone for two key National Highway projects in the Union Territory of Puducherry. The projects included construction of 4 km elevated corridor between Rajiv Gandhi Square and Indira

Gandhi Square on NH-32; Improvements to 14 km long ECR road (NH-332A). These projects will significantly reduce travel time, ease traffic congestion in the city and improve regional connectivity. Shri Gadkari also dedicated to the nation the

four-laning of the 38 km long Puducherry-Poondiyanakuppam section of NH-32 in Tamil Nadu. This section will strengthen connectivity between major ports and enhance access to key tourism and pilgrimage destinations across the region.

## NHAI Chairman Visits Under-Implementation Projects in Various States to Review the Progress

Reiterating NHAI's commitment to create world class National Highway network in the country NHAI Chairman, Shri Santosh Kumar Yadav visited various under-implementation National Highway projects in the states of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Gujarat,

During his visit to Chennai on 8 September 2025, NHAI Chairman inspected the Double Tier 4-lane Elevated Corridor connecting Chennai Port to Maduravoyal and held a detailed review meeting with NHAI officials, contractors, and consultants.



NHAI Chairman also visited Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh on 22 – 23 September 2025 and reviewed the 4-lane to 6-lane expansion with Port Connectivity from Convent Junction to Sheela Nagar in the city. The Chairman also inspected Aluru-Sabbavaram section of the Raipur-Visakhapatnam Economic Corridor.



Apart from the project visits, Chairman also planted a tree under 'Swachhata Hi Seva 2025' initiative at Jami Interchange.



To review the progress of the Eastern Peripheral Expressway-Yamuna Expressway Interchange in Uttar Pradesh, NHAI Chairman visited the project on 29 September 2025.

During the visit, comprehensive project update was presented by senior NHAI officials highlight key areas such as traffic integration and land-related issues. Chairman also visited Jewar Airport Peripheral and Secondary Access Roads, to review Right of Way and multimodal connectivity with NHAI officials and representatives from state and central agencies.



NHAI Chairman also visited Gujarat on 5 – 6 October 2025 to review the progress of multiple under-implementation projects in the state that included

Shamlaji–Motachilloda section of NH-48, Vadodara–Bharuch and Bharuch–Ankleshwar stretches, and the Ankleshwar–Vadodara–Mumbai Expressway segment of NE-4.

The Chairman also reviewed progress on the Ahmedabad–Dholera Expressway, that will help to boost industrial connectivity to the Dholera Special Investment Region.



In a routine inspection visit, the Chairman, accompanied by senior officials, also visited the Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor on 31st October 2025. This project will not only cut travel time from 5-6 hours to 2.5 hours but will support long-term economic growth of the region.

## Brainstorming Session Organised to Elevate Quality Standards in National Highways Development

A day-long brainstorming session on “Strengthening Quality in Highway Construction: Challenges & Solutions” was organised at NHAI Headquarters in New Delhi on 9th October 2025. The session was chaired by Shri V. Umashankar, Secretary, MoRTH, along with NHAI Chairman Shri Santosh Kumar Yadav and Shri V.K. Rajawat,

Director General Road Development, MoRTH. Senior officials from MoRTH, NHAI, NHIDCL, experts from premier institutes such as CSIR-CRRI, IIT Delhi, IIT Bombay, and IIT Kharagpur, as well as concessionaires, contractors, and other key stakeholders participated in the session. The deliberations focused on enhancing quality assurance, safety, and

durability in National Highway construction. Discussions covered critical aspects such as Rigid and Flexible Pavement design, Reinforced Earth (RE) Walls, Earthwork and Compaction, Slope Stability, Tunnel Engineering, Material and Field Testing, and mitigation of Bridge and Flyover failures. Here is a glimpse of the session.



## NHAI Organised Road Safety Training Workshop for Officers and Auditors in New Delhi

On 4th September 2025, NHAI organised a day-long road safety training workshop in New Delhi for Road Safety Officers and Auditors deployed on Zero Fatality Corridors. Organised in collaboration with the SaveLIFE Foundation, the workshop focused on enhancing technical expertise and strengthening on-ground implementation of safety measures to reduce road fatalities. Delivering the keynote address, Shri Vishal Chauhan, Member

(Admin), NHAI, highlighted the three pillars of road safety that included engineering interventions, human behaviour, and vehicle engineering as cornerstones of road safety. He highlighted the role of innovative tools such as Electronic Detailed Accident Database (e-DAR) for blackspot identification and Advanced Traffic Management Systems (ATMS) for improving safety outcomes. At the workshop, Shri K.N. Shrivastava (Retd.) Secretary, Ministry of Civil

Aviation, Government of India and Director, India International Centre (IIC), appreciated NHAI's contribution towards the transformation of National Highways across the country. He shared his valuable thoughts on the evolving road infrastructure landscape in India, the challenges arising from violations of road safety rules, and the need to leverage modern technology to strengthen road safety measures.



## NHAI Crosses ₹10,000 Crore Milestone in Insurance Surety Bond Adoption

NHAI has achieved a significant milestone with Insurance Surety Bonds (ISBs) issued for project contracts crossing the ₹10,000 crore mark. As of July 2025, 12 insurance companies issued around 1,600 ISBs as Bid Security and 207 ISBs as Performance Security, amounting to a total of ₹10,369 crore. NHAI has been spearheading the

adoption of ISBs as an alternative to traditional Bank Guarantees, providing contractors with a more flexible and cost-effective option for securing project commitments. On 11th September 2025, NHAI organised a workshop with stakeholders on 'Implementation of Insurance Surety Bonds and eBG in NHAI Contracts' in New Delhi. The workshop was

chaired by Shri N.R.V.V.M.K Rajendra Kumar, Member (Finance), NHAI, in presence of Shri Nilesh Sathe, Former Member, IRDA, senior NHAI officials, contractors, consultants, and representatives from leading insurance and financial institutions to accelerate the use of ISBs and Electronic Bank Guarantees (eBG).



## NHAI Achieves Breakthrough of Chhattisgarh's First National Highway Tunnel

On 4th October 2025, NHAI achieved a major milestone with the successful one-side breakthrough of Chhattisgarh's first National Highway tunnel. The 2.79 km long twin-tube tunnel is being constructed

as a part of Raipur–Visakhapatnam Economic Corridor on NH-130CD. Showcasing exceptional engineering proficiency, the tunnel breakthrough was completed in just 12 months. The Raipur–Visakhapatnam Economic Corridor

will significantly reduce travel time, enhance trade and logistics connectivity, as well as boost regional development across the states of Chhattisgarh, Odisha, and Andhra Pradesh.



## NHAI to Install QR Code Sign Boards with Project Specific Information of National Highways

In order to enhance transparency and provide 'Ease of Commuting' to the National Highway users, NHAI will install Project Information Sign Boards with 'Quick Response (QR) Codes' along the National Highway stretches. The vertical QR Code Sign Boards will provide project-specific information including National Highway number,

Highway chainage, project length, construction/maintenance periods, Contact numbers for Highway Patrol, Toll Manager, Project Manager, Resident Engineer, Emergency Helpline 1033, NHAI field office as well as details about nearby facilities like hospitals, petrol pumps, toilets, police stations, restaurants, distance to toll

plaza, truck lay bye, puncher repair shop and vehicle service stations/e-Charging Station etc. For enhanced visibility, the 'QR Code' sign boards will be placed near wayside amenities, rest areas, toll plazas, truck lay-byes, highway start/end points, and signages for the convenience of National Highway users.



## NHAI Completes Phase-I of Yargi-Kalewa Section on India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway

In a significant step towards strengthening regional connectivity, NHAI has successfully completed Phase-I of the 52 km long Yargi-Kalewa section on the India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway, and handed it over to the Ministry of Construction, Government of Myanmar on 3rd October 2025. Funded by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Government of India, the project is a key component of the Act East Policy, aimed at enhancing land trade and transport linkages between India and Southeast Asia.



# Innovation Hackathon 2025 Organised for Better Maintenance of Toilet Blocks

NHAI organized the Innovation Hackathon 2025, providing a platform for innovators, designers, and problem-solvers to present creative ideas for the "Better maintenance of toilet blocks on National Highways across India." The initiative received an overwhelming

response with 138 entries from various stakeholders. After a detailed evaluation, Team LOOMITRA secured the first position with 75 marks, followed by Md Salik Inam with 70 marks, and Rahul with 65 marks.

The Hackathon reflects NHAI's initiatives to foster innovation and develop technology-driven solutions aimed at improving user convenience and maintenance efficiency across the National Highway network.



# NHAI Organised Blood Donation Camp to Mark National Voluntary Blood Donation Day

On 1st October 2025, NHAI organized a blood donation camp at its Headquarters in New Delhi to mark National Voluntary

Blood Donation Day. NHAI officials and staff members participated wholeheartedly, spreading awareness about the life-saving

significance of blood donation and reinforcing the spirit of collective responsibility.



## NHAI Facilitates Meritorious Student Achievers Across Six States

In a unique initiative aimed at fostering excellence, NHAI organized a nationwide drive to facilitate and encourage meritorious school students across six states of Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, and Andhra Pradesh. As part of this initiative to motivate school and girl students, over 1,050 items including Tablets, 650 Bicycles, and 400 School bags have been awarded to the high achieving students. The drive was led by NHAI field offices, in association with various contractors and

concessionaires, who participated in the drive under their respective Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives.

Under this noble initiative, NHAI field office in Vizianagaram awarded 103 bicycles to meritorious Class X students. 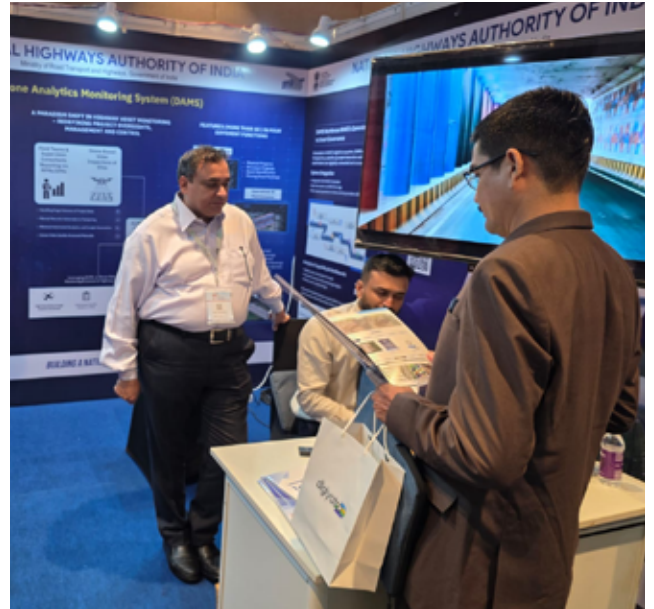


## NHAI Honoured with 'Gold Award' for Drone Analytics Monitoring System at National Conference on e-Governance 2025

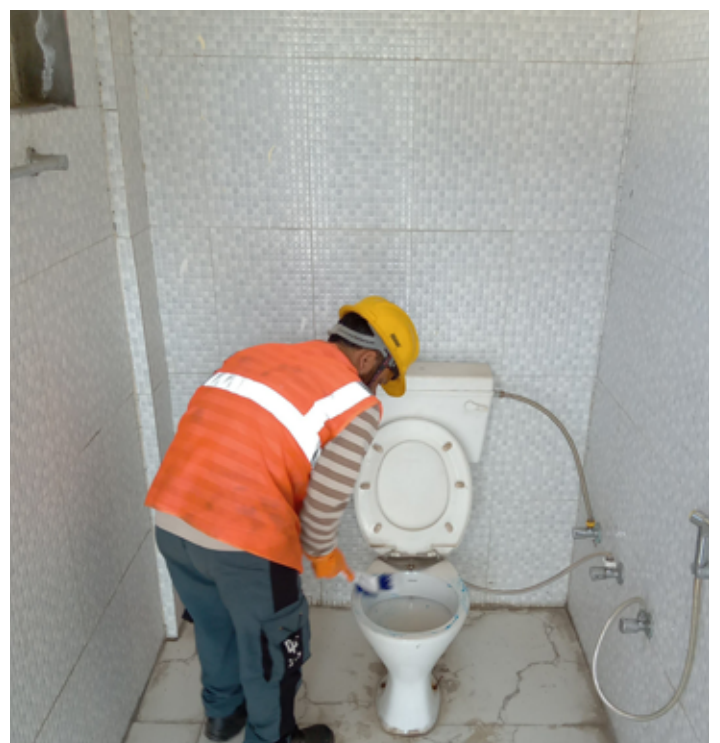

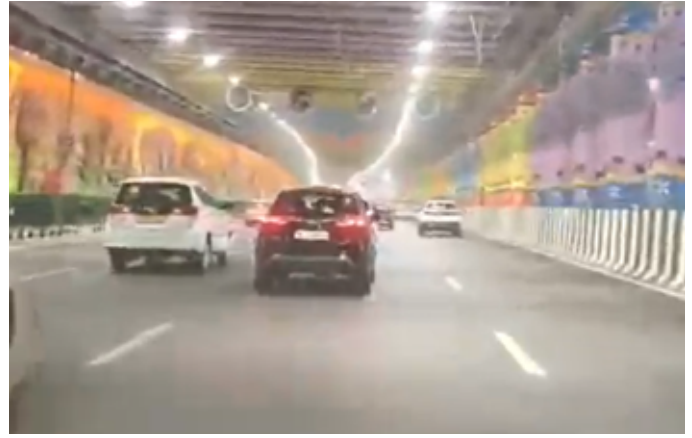

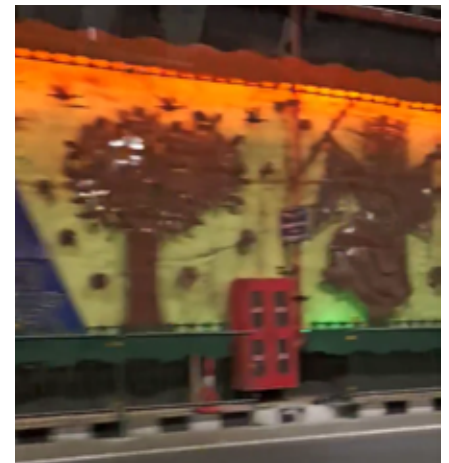
